Comments: Site looks good

Every beneficial plant is beginning to thrive as we enter Spring. The ecosystem has attracted many waterfowl and the water clarity high. Lily pads are one of the best native plants to help filtrate the water and increase water clarity.

Management Summary

The picture in the top right shows Pickerelweed that was recently effected by disease or predation. As Spring approaches, I am noticing dozens of new leaves emerging from the root ball. In fact, many Pickerelweed within the littoral shelf are in full bloom purple. I was surprised to noticed a 5-7 pound bass nesting along the perimeter within the beneficial plants.

This pond is looking fantastic.

Recommendations/Action Items

- Monitor Pickerel as they regrow.
- Continue to spot spray Alligatorweed, Torpedograss, Cattail and Primrose as they emerge within the beneficial plants.
