Comments: Requires attention

During the June inspection of the waterway at Thurston Groves, Alligator Weed was observed growing within the beneficial aquatic vegetation along the perimeter. Additionally, regrowth of Primrose was observed within the littoral shelf.

Management Summary

During the June Account Inspection of Thurston Groves, the following observations were made:

- Alligator Weed was present within the beneficial Gulf Spikerush along the perimeter of the waterway.
- Regrowth of Primrose was observed within the littoral shelf.
- Shoreline grasses were present within the Northern cove of the waterway.
- The Plecostomus populations inhabiting Thurston Groves were not observed burrowing within the shoreline.
- Water clarity and quality had remained high due to healthy beneficial vegetation.
- The planted aquatic vegetation had continued to flourish along the perimeter as desired.

Recommendations/Action Items

Aquatic Systems, Inc. will address the following during our upcoming scheduled visits:

- Control the Alligator Weed growing amongst the beneficial vegetation along the shoreline during our next scheduled visit.
- Target the regrowth of Primrose within the littoral shelf during our next scheduled treatment.
- Perform detailed grass treatments along the perimeter of the waterway and within the Northern cove.
- Clear the control structure of all flow-restricting materials.
- Continue to monitor the water quality and clarity of the waterway.
- Monitor the burrowing behavior of the present Plecostomus populations.
- Follow up with all previous treatments to ensure that desired results are achieved.
