During the week of this inspection, the waterway at Thurston Groves was targeted for nuisance / invasive vegetation within the littoral shelf. Additionally, lilies were targeted growing outside of the littoral area and towards the fountain.

Management Summary

During the October Account Inspection of Thurston Groves, the recently planted Florida native beneficial plants were establishing nicely along the perimeter of the site. This vegetation is anticipated to continue to grow together to create a barrier along the length of the perimeter.

Successful spot-spray treatments were observed within the littoral area, targeting Primrose, Cattails, and Torpedo Grass within the shelf to create a more aesthetically pleasing shelf that contains desired Florida native beneficial plants. During the week of this inspection, the lily pads growing outside of the littoral area and away from the shoreline were targeted to prevent them from approaching the fountain.

Recommendations/Action Items

The following will be addressed during our upcoming scheduled visits:

- Monitor the littoral shelf for regrowth of undesired vegetation, with additional treatments to be performed as necessary.
- Closely monitor the growth and survivorship of Florida Native Beneficial Plants.
- Observe Plecostomus population and their burrowing behavior.
- Monitor decomposition of lily populations, to be retreated as required as they spread away from the littoral area.
- Follow up with all previous treatments to ensure desired results are achieved.
