Comments: Requires attention

The waterway at Thurston Groves was in need of continued attention and aggressive treatments during this inspection to target the overgrowth of Primrose and Cattails within the littoral shelf, as well as for shoreline grasses amongst the beneficial vegetation.

Management Summary

The overgrowth of Primrose and Cattails within the littoral shelf had been targeted during the week of this inspection. The littoral shelf will require ongoing aggressive maintenance to regain control of the undesired vegetation. Additional shoreline grass treatments are necessary to control the Torpedo Grass and Alligator Weed amongst the beneficial plants. Hydrilla, an invasive submersed weed, was observed at a 5-10 foot band along the perimeter of the site, and will be treated systemically this autumn.

Recommendations/Action Items

Aquatic Systems, Inc. will focus on the following during our upcoming scheduled visits:

- Continue to perform aggressive spot-spray grass treatments to regain control of the undesired growth within the littoral shelf, while closely monitoring the decomposition process.
- Apply additional spot-spray grass treatments along the perimeter of the waterway targeting Torpedo Grass and Alligator Weed amongst the beneficial vegetation.
- Administer a systemic submersed weed treatment targeting Hydrilla throughout the waterway.
- Clear the control structure of flow-restricting materials.
- Follow up with all previous treatments until desired conditions are achieved and maintained.

Aquatic Systems, Inc. will continue to care for the littoral shelf and waterway within the Thurston Groves Community.
